The following language is hereby added to Prime Vendor contract # SP0300-03-D-3005:

Force Protection Background

The Defense Supply Center Philadelphia (DSCP) – Directorate of Subsistence provides world-class subsistence logistics support in peacetime, as well as during regional conflicts, contingency operations, national emergencies, and natural disasters. Consequently, the United States Government, to include its personnel, resources, and interests, may become the target of enemy aggression, which may include espionage, sabotage, and/or terrorism. This increased risk requires DSCP to take preventative steps to address the possibility of deliberate tampering and/or contamination of subsistence items. The term “*force prevention*” refers to those procedures and plans deemed necessary to ensure the safeguard of said products.

- A. Based upon the above information, a determination has been made to incorporate a ***Force Protection Plan*** into all DSCP subsistence contracts. Under this ***Force Protection Plan***, the vendor is responsible for the following:
1. The vendor will ensure that products and/or packaging have not been tampered with, altered in any manner, or otherwise contaminated during the manufacturing, storage, and delivery process.
 2. The contractor shall proactively employ methods to decrease the possibility of product integrity failure. Such methods may include, but are not limited to:
 - Fencing around the perimeter of all places of performance
 - Guards and/or surveillance equipment
 - Issuance of Employee Identification Badges
 - Procedures to limit access to sensitive areas (such as places of manufacture, processing, storage, and shipment)
 - Background checks on all employees (to include truck drivers)
 - Procedures to secure delivery vehicles when deliveries are in process
 - The ability to track and locate delivery vehicles and contract drivers on their delivery routes
 - 24-Hour notice of all incoming freight carriers or raw material suppliers prior to delivery
 - Inspection of all incoming materials and products related to the subject contract
 3. The vendor will inform DSCP (immediately) of any attempt or suspected attempt by any party or parties, known or unknown, to contaminate supplies. When notifying DSCP of just such an event, it is imperative to provide the following information:
 - Date of Incident
 - Customer Name, Address, and Phone Number
 - Affected Line Item

- Observations made by delivery personnel and customers regarding the subject incident
 - Regulatory agency or agencies involved
 - Names of contacted law enforcement agencies
 - Information as to how the incident was resolved and what conclusions were drawn by the regulatory agency
 - What changes have been initiated to preclude or prevent the recurrence of similar situations
- B. The Government reserves the right to inspect the contractor's facility to ensure that the appropriate security measures are currently in place.
- C. All other terms and conditions of the original contract shall remain the same.
